
SOWING GENEROUSLY

Giving to sustain our current mission

In 2025, our goal is to increase giving by **4.5%** to meet our budget. This increase is needed to fund our new FT Assistant Minister for Youth, and meet inflationary costs on existing expenses. 87% of the income required to sustain our mission comes from the generous and sacrificial giving of our church family.



DID YOU KNOW?

In 2024 we budgeted for a 4.5% increase in offertory, but God enabled us to increase our giving by 8%.

In 2024 around 134 households gave regularly to support the mission

BUT WHAT IF...

If God enabled us to increase our giving by **10-15%** we could start to consider exciting opportunities for **future mission** like:

A new staffing appointment - cross-cultural

A new staffing appointment - pastoral care

Growing our trainee and student minister programs

New local/global mission partners

If we contributed beyond our regular giving with **one-off gifts** we could undertake **premises projects** to better enable our mission. Potential future projects include:

Commercial kitchen upgrade for Water Street (\$65k)

Air-conditioning for Pearces Corner hall (\$20k) Organ electrics overhaul at Water Street (\$25k) Improve traffic flow, child safety, and outdoor shaded areas at Pearces Corner (\$?)
